HUBER PHOTOGRAPHS ON DISPLAY AT KENTUCKY EMPLOYEES CREDIT UNION

“Plantforms,” an exhibition by Louisville photographer Lisa J. Huber, is on display through November at Kentucky Employees Credit Union, located at 100 Moore Drive, just off the intersection of KY 676 (East-West Connector) and Martin Luther King Boulevard in Frankfort. The exhibition features eight of Ms. Huber’s silver gelatin prints. The gallery is open during credit union business hours, Monday through Thursday 8:00am to 5:00pm, Friday 8:00am to 6:00pm and Saturday 9:00am to 1:00pm. **An open house and reception for the artist will be held Friday, October 29th from 5:00 to 8:00pm.**

Of the spare and ethereal images of the minutiae of nature that comprise this series, Ms. Huber notes, “When we look at nature, we tend to see the whole, and not its parts. A panoramic view, a forest, a garden - we see examples of these everyday, but we rarely have time to examine each individual tree, each leaf, each flower. Photography provides us with an alternative way of looking at the world. A photographer can render something ordinary extraordinary through the vehicle of his or her camera.” In this case, the limitations of that vehicle contribute to the aesthetic: “These photographs are from a series that I shot with a plastic camera called the Holga. The Holga's plastic lens creates effects such as vignetting, light leaks, double exposure and the resulting shots have a generally hazy, dreamy look. I framed the plants and trees against the sky to showcase their individual and unique characteristics. I toned my prints sepia to convey the sense of timelessness that natural landscapes express.”

Ms. Huber holds a BA in Art from the University of Louisville and an MFA in Photography from Virginia Commonwealth University. Currently, she is the Curator of Exhibits at the Kentucky Derby Museum in Louisville, Kentucky, and does freelance photography in her spare time.
